Medication Assisted Therapy

Use Naltrexone in caution with patients who have opiates within last 7 days or LFT's 3x or greater than normal

ALT: AST:

Naltrexone (REVIA) Tablet - preferred in patients not on opiates

Disp-30 tablet, R-0

Acamprosate (CAMPRAL) Tablet - preferred in patients on opiates

Disp-180 tablet, R-0

Disulfiram Tablet

500 mg, Disp-14 tablet, R-0

Alcohol Withdrawal Order Set Modification

▼ MEDICATION ASSISTED THERAPY

▼ Medications

Naltrexone:

Use with caution with patients who have opiates within last 7 days or LFT's 3x or greater than normal (reconsider use in any instances of acute hepatitis of transaminase level)

Prominent Side Effects include nausea and vomiting (29-33%)

ALT: AST:

Acamprosate

Contraindicated w/ CrCl <30 ml/min

Reduce Target Dose for weight less than 60 Kg or CrCl between 30-50 mL/min to: 333 mg PO TID

Prominent Side Effects include diarrhea

Estimated Creatinine Clearance: 122.4 mL/min (by C-G formula based on SCr of 0.86 mg/dL).

Naltrexone (REVIA) Tablet

50 mg, ORAL, DAILY MORNING

Acamprosate (CAMPRAL) Delayed Release Tablet

666 mg, ORAL, THREE TIMES DAILY
